

Summary:

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness and Planning compiles the census report twice a year. The report includes key statistics such as total number of students, gender breakdown, program-specific student distribution, CAPA and Bachelor's student demographics, faculty-to-student ratio, etc.

For Spring 2023, the data was captured on February 6. When comparing the total number of active students in Fall 2022 to the total number of active students in Spring 2023, a 12.2% increase in overall enrollment is seen. The ratio of female to male students (45:55) remained almost the same. While comparing the data from Spring 2022 to Spring 2023, there wasn't a significant variation in total number of Bachelor's students. Moreover, a 34% raise in the total number of CAPA students have been seen (mostly due to new scholarship opportunities). A significant rise in new student's enrollments is seen, a 97.3% rise compared to Spring 2022. On the other note, Architectural Engineering enrolls the most students with 27.9% of all active students, followed by Business with 21.3%, and Nursing with 10.1% respectively. There are 288 confirmed alumni in total, with the most graduates coming from the Oil & Gas Management program. The student to faculty (Full Time Equivalent) ratio is 15:1. The FTE (Full-Time Equivalent) ratio of full-time faculty to adjunct faculty is 2:1; as per FTE there are 26 full-time faculty members and 13 Adjuncts.





Enrollments

The enrollment figures for the Spring 2023 are shown in Table 1. On average, there are 18 students in each class; in Fall 2022, the average number of students per class were 17. The total number of class sections is 139. The table also includes the ratios between full time faculty to adjuncts and faculty to students. The ratio of faculty to students is **15:1**, which is the same as the previous semester.

The intervals or bin in the first columns of Table 2 shows the range of students per each semester. When comparing Spring 2023 with Spring 2022, a 26% decrease has been noticed in the class size of 1 - 5. Furthermore, a 23.6% decrease has been noticed when comparing class size of 11 - 15. Additionally, 85.7% increase has been notices for a bigger class size of 31 to 35.

Table 3: Number of Confirmed Graduates




Table 3 displays the number of confirmed graduates, and the graph below the table displays graduates per program.



Number of Active Bachelor and CAPA Students in Last 9 Semesters




Figure 4: Number of active Students (Bachelor's students and CAPA students)




Figure 5: Trends of active Bachelor's students per fall and spring semester.




Figure 7: New Students Per Semester (Bachelor + CAPA)






Figure 12: Scholarship, and Self-funded students' analysis

One hundred and six (106) students are studying under the DoS scholarship program, out of which 85 (80.19%) are female and 21(19.81%) are male. The DoS scholarship plays a significant role in increasing the female ratio at AUK. Out of 836 students actively studying at AUK, 378 are female students, of which 22.4% of females are studying under the DoS scholarship grant.
